Topic: **Discussion:** Action: 1. Welcome & Introductions Meeting started at 4:05 w/ - Dr. Kamana Beamer, welcome, pule & introductions. Chair a) Welcome No quorum – no family member b) Confirm Quorum present. c) Review & Approve Minutes from May 19, Approved 5/19/14 minutes pending 2014 guorum and will then post on both WMS and HC websites. d) Preview Agenda No revisions to the agenda. 2. Principal's Update - Matt MHorne reported receiving WMS preliminary Group asked not to release data Horne Strive HI results just 10 minutes before the start until embargo is lifted. a) Recap of 13-14 of LAP meeting - will share with staff 1st thing **Progress** tomorrow. Said these results are still officially embargoed to give schools time to review and appeal. Reviewed WMS results – WMS did improve overall score from 147 (2012-'13SY) to 158 (2013-'14SY) – an increase of 11 points. "This is the direction we want to be heading in." Biggest achievements were reducing the GAP Rate and progress with improving 2-Year Gap Reduction Rate. School still in Continuous Improvement but higher up in statewide ranking. Also said "cohort data shows compelling growth." Was modest slump in math proficiency; GKaulukukui asked about this and JEnglishSommerville explained new curriculum may have contributed to this -- an "implementation dip" is not uncommon w/ new curriculum. Also said the new standards for 7<sup>th</sup> grade are more "abstract" so are a significant shift for students and we're seeing this in test results. Also discussed WMS low science proficiency – MHorne something is happening w/ this assessment because student performance is low statewide. b) Significant Plans for MHorne reviewed "big push this year will be 14-15 implementation of Accreditation Action Plans" to address the Visiting Committee's eight major recommendations. Said WMS was extremely ambitious in our proposed draft Action Plans we had 21-22 - not realistic so focusing on the 8

priorities set by Visiting Cmte. Teacher-staff teams will be calendaring what's reasonable.

Brief discussion about Governance issue – does school want to explore independent governance? MHorne said he was told by HC's ED that WMS must immediately move forward on this. Said it's quite complex as it involves the charter commission and DOE, has never been done and has legal and financial implications; also, there is a question about whether there is school-community support – people willing to do the heavy lifting? GKaulukukui said the board wants the school to know they support the school if the school wants to change its governance model, but he "doesn't feel a need to rush and will get back to MHorne on this." It was noted that this is not mentioned in the 8 recommendations from the Accreditation Visiting Cmte.

JBowman said it might be time to do a temperature check with faculty-staff and community.

NMurphy said HC has worked on being more visible; also said we need to build time into faculty-staff meetings to bring everyone up to speed on this.

PCook said she thought there are three significant issues to consider: the school's Academic progress, leadership capacity and funding options.

MHorne completed overview of SY and mentioned inclusion, and parent NLindsey again expressed concerns – "Will my child have the support she needs; used to be a 1:5 teacher-student ratio; not sure this year but may be in a class of 20-25 students.

GKaulukukui asked how inclusion will work. AKendziorski explained that inclusion is a federal law and decisions are "driven by the child's IEP goals; also, there are intervention classes at the end of the school day providing an extra 42 minutes. IEPs are created with parents fully involved. MHorne suggested he and Amy meet with Nancy the next day to discuss further. NLindsey agreed.

3. Ho'okako'o Local School Board & Charter Update – Guy Kaulukukui, Interim HC Executive Director MHorne also reviewed new school hours (longer day mandated by the legislature), new schedule that includes exploratories and interventions, and new hires.

Guy Kaulukukui shared that he has been appointed Interim ED for HC while Dr.

McCorriston is out on maternity leave – not full time but available when needed. Said with having lost Aja and Tess leaving, HC staff is "lite." He has temporarily stepped down from the HC Board to assist with this – also made a contribution to HC equivalent to a month's compensation to support HC and the schools. Also said the HC board has contributed a total of \$30,000 to HC to support their work – a significant step forward in HC striving to become sustainable.

Said his priorities include finalizing the 2014-'15 SY MOA w/ KS – still unresolved but hopeful that it will be soon. Also trying to get KS to be thinking about a 3-5 year agreement instead of annual renewal.

GKaulukukui was asked about funding for WMS – said WMS "will probably get it; other schools already have it – gotta close the gap – we are living with some legacy issues related to former board members." From his perspective, the HC schools are doing well – all three Accredited and audited. Thinks there's still a lingering perception of the HC board being "distanced" from the schools. Working to dispel that.

GKaulukukui said HC board has committed to a full board meeting at each school annually – might hold first meeting here at WMS as early as October.

KS expecting HC to raise its own funding; goal this year was \$1M – came in "under target." He agreed that there's only a little that the 3 schools can do to improve DOE per pupil, but that there's "lots more HC can do to court KS – KS is more important than the state."

PCook asked how WMS can help improve relationship/communications with KS as the schools' primary non-legislative funder – that

our teacher team is doing very good work with integrating core curriculum with 'Ike Hawai'i values and practices – often we are setting the bar, teaching other schools – for example, how to integrate lessons related to the Hokule'a's WWV into science, math, LA; also, our science and Mala'ai teaching team are leading a "teach the teachers" training program for a 3<sup>rd</sup> year. It seems like the "line staff" at KS are aware of this good work but perhaps not the higher ups.

GKaulukukui acknowledged he is working on this and welcomes our thoughts and input.

Brief discussion about who the key contacts are at KS: Waialeale Sarsona, Brandon Ledward and Ka'eo Duarte.

GKaulukukui described a retreat HC holding the next week led by HC's Education Committee (Bob Peters and Don Young) – establishing a Leadership Academy to create our own pool of school leaders. An opportunity for our principals etc. to all work together.
