A Fascinating Social Studies-Language Arts-Art Appreciation-'Ike Hawai'i Lesson...

How A Legendary Mo'o Helps Teach The Power of Voting!

The lesson seems quite simple: Naming an untitled piece of art. But look again. Not only is this piece of art riveting, conjuring up 100+ questions...but it is just a tiny piece of a journey of learning that WMS teachers took 8th grade Social Studies students on recently – resulting in so much more than just a deep and meaningful name for the piece of art.

The lesson began with the traditional Hawaiian story of **Mo'oinanea** – a legendary mo'o that lives atop Mauna Kea. Two of **Kanu o Ka 'Aina's** high school students, **Makana Mahuna** and **Kayala Kahaulelio**, working with their teacher, **Kanoa Castro**, created this fabulous visual of Mo'oinanea and came to share it with **Ms. Catherine Shafer's Social Studies classes** as kumu **Ku'ulei Keakealani** revealed the story. Students were than asked to research further, craft a title for the artwork and

then write a persuasive essay supporting their title. Kumu **Keali'i Bertelmann** helped, sharing pointers about Hawaiian words and phrases and as an artist. The completed essays supporting a title for the piece were taken to Kanu o ka 'Aina and students there chose the top five names. Then '**Ike Hawai'i Resource Teacher Pua Case** brought them back to WMS and each of the five top essays were shared with students along with the title suggested. Part of this guided lesson included discussing the significance of voting – having a voice, taking your voice and vote seriously, and that your voice counts! And then students voted.

And the winning name: The Guarded Stories of Mauna a Wakea.
