Committee Report	 status of development activities: HC has received \$80,357 in new gifts and grants so far in FY 2015 including \$50,000 from Hawaiian Airlines and \$20,000 from Verizon. Currently, there is over \$100,000 in requests that are pending approval including a \$50,000 proposal to HEI Charitable Foundation for WMS's school buses. Upcoming grants and solicitations include OHA, US DOE, HMSA and others. Fundraising and Development planning and implementation continues to be rolled out at all three schools. In particular, HC is working to expand its fundraising and development support to WMS (e.g. establishing working relationships and capacity, prospect identification, grant writing, developing procedures and infrastructure)
