School Climate - 8 events in the first 6 weeks of school: Gear Up; FF Huaka'i to Waipi'o Valley/Service Learning; Opening Day; 3 GL Field Trips; Fun Run; Open House - testimony to positive school climate

Fun Run Epilogue – More than 3x as many participated this SY; Used Chromebook giveaway, iPad Door Prize, outreach to families, "School Messenger" to families and news & social media coverage, tempting auction all helped. Virtually all participants contributed at least \$10 to WMS for K(Arts). Many faculty, staff & Advisories contributed appealing gift baskets and many faculty-staff assisted w/ event. Exceptional community response to auction donation requests. Positive feedback from those who attended. Need to improve registration line.

Attendance - 15% Chronic YTD. Look at it from a different angle – Check out Waipahu ppt: 
<u>file:///C:/Users/Patti Cook/Downloads/DXP2019 Sessionl Chronic Absenteeism.pdf</u> – Waipahu school experienced dramatic improvements – from about 30% chronic to 12%. Many reasons students miss school including health issues. LAP teacher rep suggested awarding Spirit Points by grade level for attendance. Also discussed taking the idea employed at Waipahu of a data wall – and creating a virtual data wall; also put info on the electronic school sign and social media. Will continue to explore options and evaluate what works.

### Trajectory - Trauma informed FF -

Discussion about what incentives teachers? More than money - Self-care opportunities for staff who work with children of trauma.

Anti-Bullying Update - Supports we are layering in. Some mental health issues for students are the result of trauma from elementary bullying. This came up during Accreditation at WES. Members of our LAP were part

Ho'okako'o Update – Board member Paul Nakayama represented HC as David Gibson unable. Discussed lawsuit settlement: board has been in discussions with the lawyers from DOE & AG. The collective opinion from HC is to have the DOE pay.

#### **Additional Schoolwide Priorities**

- Reading recruiting adult reading partners: See purple handout attached for more info. LAP teacher rep
  Barbara Haight welcomes help with recruiting 1-2 adults in each class period. The EA/migrant tutor
  assignment is not consistent. Please be in touch with Barb if interested in helping with reading or know
  of others who would be.
- Teacher PD Math and Science Math PD and resources paid with Title I Funds. Amplify Science
  curriculum is paid with a Hawai'i Community Foundation Career Connected Learning grant. Next
  Generation Science Standards are being taught. The new state test will reflect Next Gen. standards. Our
  proficiency with the old assessment at 8th grade is 50%.

Discussed teacher-staff recognition for performing over and above – union contract constraints and school leadership actions to acknowledge good work.
