#### Core Value Focus: Ha'aheo & 'Imi 'Ike

Ha'aheo refers to the more positive character of pride, as in pride for the accomplishments of others. Unselfish pride. Ha'aha'a is the value of humility. It urges us to be humble, and to be modest. However Ha'aha'a does not promote lowliness, reticence or a lack of assertiveness. A good way to understand Ha'aha'a is in thinking about the two different words for pride in the Hawaiian culture: Ha'aheo is desired, and ho'okano is not. Ha'aha'a does encompass pride in your accomplishments recognizing there is merit in feeling proud of the good things you have done — this is ha'aheo. Ho'okano is the unfavorable pride of arrogance and condescension, haughtiness and conceit. In practicing Ha'aha'a we want to be open-minded most of all, for that is how we will open up our own Palena 'ole capacity for greater learning abundance.
