Grand Finale To Honor Kumu Pua







'You Can't Spaz Out!'

The two youngest Hokule'a crew members — Leiohu Colburn and Kaneala Anakalea-Buckley, both of Waimea — came to WMS Friday to share lessons learned during their recent 18-stop voyage with Capt. Chadd Paishon and Kumu Keala Kahuanui. "When you're holding the line that ties the canoe to a tug boat entering a bay, you can't spaz out - you must listen to instructions and respond quickly." Kumu Keala jumped in here: "You know when your mom says 'take out the trash' and you don't respond right away...no time for that on the canoe; you gotta listen and respond!" Leiohu and Kaneala said, they have now accepted responsibility for passing on voyaging traditions from Papa Mau and Capt. Chadd. "We all have kuleana. What is yours?" Students said: "Cook rice!" "Wash dishes." "Wash clothes." Kumu Keala interjected: "At some point you are going to have to take on kuleana." "Yes, it was difficult."
