Draft Environmental Assessment Released!

Our 9-Classroom STEM Building Moves Forward

As anticipated, most of the remaining required permits for our 9-Classroom STEM Building were posted for public review and comment yesterday by the Office of Environmental Quality Control (OEQC) in their bi-monthly Environmental Notice e-newsletter.

See the highlighted link below to review the entire packet of documents, which contains lots of detailed information about all aspects of the project. The statutory 30-day public review and comment period runs to April 7, 2015.

Funding for this project was authorized by the 2013 and 2014 State Legislatures and the Governor has released the entire \$14.98 million for the project. Bids were opened recently and the winning bidder is expected to announced soon. To review project documents, go to:

Project Description:

Waimea Middle School is located next to Waimea Elementary on an approx. 26-acre parcel identified as TMK: 6-7-002:015. The new eight classroom building project site is in the southeast portion of the campus, between the Mala'ai learning garden and four existing portable classroom buildings. The portables are to remain with no changes. The new building will provide modern classrooms and laboratories including spaces specifically designed as 21st century computer labs. Although identified as 8 classrooms, during the planning process, original planned spaces were downsized to allow a total of 9 classrooms. Thus, the 2-story rectangular building will include four general classrooms, three science labs, two computer labs, a teacher planning room, one office, one student services room, a faculty center, a conference room and restrooms. Also, to fully integrate the STEM building with hands-on, place-based lessons in the adjacent Mala'ai garden, an exterior mini-amphitheatre is included. The project also includes paving the one way inbound gravel entry drive from Lindsey Road.
